Statement of Purpose: As the Crawford Chair in Agricultural Economics at the Australian National University and with prior experience as a Deputy Director of China Center for Agricultural Policy (CCAP) and New Institute of Rural Development (NIRD) at Peking University, I have been privileged to serve in various leadership and administrative roles. My dedication to the field is evident in my current role as President of the East Asia branch of the Australasian Agricultural and Resource Economics Society (AARES)

and as Vice President of the Asian Society of Agricultural Economists (ASAE). I have taken responsibilities in organizing international conferences to foster collaborations between research institutes, government agencies, non-profit organizations, and the private sector, as well as to promote mentoring and training for a more diverse group of junior faculty and PhD students. My engagement with the public sector, including my previous position at ABARES and collaborations with international organizations such as ERS-USDA, OECD TAD and IFPRI, has enriched my experience in extending research to public benefit. In my editorial role as Associate Editor and Co-editor of the Australian Journal of Agricultural and Resource Economics (AJARE), I have worked to enhance the journal's reputation and credibility in the academic community, and to improve the fairness and efficiency of the peer review process. As President, I would devote to: (1) develop further pathways for advanced professional enhancement and scholarly communication in the agricultural and natural resource economic sector; (2) extend the horizons of AARES journals to embrace cutting-edge and high-quality research endeavors; (3) boost opportunities for postgraduate students and early-career economists to actively involve themselves in AARES's events; (4) break down disciplinary silos, encouraging cross-disciplinary interaction and dialogue between agricultural and resource economics and other academic fields.
