

Thesis chapter competition

- The prize is \$500 and one year of student membership of AARES.
- Any Masters or PhD student enrolled at a university in the ACT can enter a chapter from their thesis. The chapter can be from a thesis in-progress or a submitted thesis, provided the Masters or PhD degree has not yet been conferred on the 11 November 2022.
- The chapter can be on any topic relevant to AARES (e.g., agricultural economics, environmental economics, food economics, resource economics, or agribusiness).
- Chapters will be judged based on writing style, interpretation and analysis of theory and evidence, contribution to knowledge, and policy relevance.
- Entries must be emailed to <u>tim.capon@csiro.au</u> using "AARES ACT thesis chapter competition" as the subject heading. Your email should state your university and student number. Entries can be made at any stage from now until 5pm Friday 1 1 November 2022.



Student essay competition

- The prize is \$500 and one year of student membership of AARES.
- Any undergraduate or postgraduate student enrolled at a university in the ACT can enter this competition.
- The essay can be on any topic relevant to AARES (e.g., agricultural economics, environmental economics, food economics, resource economics, or agribusiness).
- Essays should be maximum of 2,500 words and can be based on an essay written for your university work, or a new essay written especially for this competition.
- Essays will be judged based on writing style, persuasiveness, understanding of the relevant economic theories and context, and policy relevance.
- Entries must be emailed to <u>tim.capon@csiro.au</u> using "AARES ACT student essay competition" as the subject heading. Your email should state your university and student number. Entries can be made at any stage from now until 5pm Friday 11 November 2022.
